Welcome & Introductions

Grace Hou, Ryan Croke, Mary Killough and Serena Worthington welcomed everyone to the meeting. Each member of the Community Advisory Council introduced themselves and shared a main area of focus/pressing concern.

Overview of Executive Order

Liz Vogt provided a high-level overview of the Governor's Executive Order and deliverables under the Executive Order including establishing an Inter-Agency Task Force, establishing a Community Advisory Council, hosting at least three meetings of each of these bodies, working with a research partner, hiring an MPA Chief, hiring support staff, engaging the public, producing an MPA by 12/31/25 and providing a status report by 12/31/26.

Focus of Community Advisory Council

Serena Worthington provided information on the focus and scope of the Community Advisory Council and established guiding principles for the work. Serena shared a draft Charter with the group.

National Landscape and MPA Opportunities

Torshira Moffett provided a presentation on MPAs in other states, considerations and steps for developing an MPA, and resources available for use by the group.

Illinois Aging Together – Effort to Date

Wesley Epplin provided information on the grassroots campaign, Illinois Aging Together, that laid the groundwork for the Governor's Executive Order including conducting research, hosting roundtables and introducing legislation.

University Partners

Amanda Lewis, Uchechi Mitchell and Wesley Epplin described the role of UIC and HMPRG to assist with research and facilitate community engagement efforts to support development of the MPA.

Group Poll & Open Discussion

The UIC team facilitated a group poll and discussion via Menti centered on the following questions:

- 1. What issue do you most want to see addressed in the MPA?
- 2. What one state-level policy change do you think is most important for promoting healthy aging in Illinois?
- 3. What data do you think is most important for the research team to examine as they are developing the MPA?
