A brief summary

- ➤ Both lawsuits alleged violations of the ADA and Olmstead Supreme Court Decision.
- ➤ Both settlements seek to provide Class Members with services in the least restrictive and most integrated setting possible.

Williams Consent Decree

- Consent Decree entered in 2010
- > Parties agreed that:
 - ➤ All persons with SMI in SMHRFs have the right to choose to live in community-based settings;
 - No individual with an SMI who is determined to be able to live in a community-based setting shall be admitted to a LTC facility before first being offered community-based services; and
 - The State has an obligation to expand the community-based service system to support Class Members' needs.

Colbert Consent Decree

- Consent Decree entered in 2011
- > Parties agreed that the State defendants:
 - ➤ Inform Class Members regarding their eligibility for community-based services;
 - Provide comprehensive evaluations to determine Class Member eligibility for community-based services;
 - Provide, as appropriate, Class Members with housing, services and supports in a community-based setting.

Williams Class Members Defined:

- Illinois resident (state-wide);
- > 18 years of age or older;
- Have a mental illness;
- Are institutionalized in a SMHRF; and
- Are able to live in the community with specialized supports and services.

~4,000 Class Members

23 SMHRFs state-wide

Colbert Class Members Defined:

- Cook County resident;
- > 18 years of age or older;
- Have a disability;
- Reside in a SNF (in Cook County);
- Are able to live in the community with appropriate supports and services; and
- Medicaid eligible.

~18,900 Class Members

190+ Cook County Nursing Facilities

*Exclusionary Criteria

- Required activities (high-level) = outreach, evaluation, service planning, transitions, and reporting.
- > Required activities (in the weeds) = Implementation Plan.
 - > FY22 IP contains 100+ separate strategies.
 - Each strategy has an action, performance metric, expected outcome, and due date.
- Required activity (Williams only) = Front Door

2020-2021 Updates

Comprehensive Class Member Transition Program (CCMTP)

- > Started February 2020. Ends June 2022.
- Combined operations of Williams and Colbert Consent Decree
- > Pilot with goals of:
 - Streamline and standardize processes across both Williams and Colbert Consent Decrees.
 - Improve service quality.
 - Heighten the State's compliance with and performance under the Implementation Plans and Consent Decrees.

CCMTP General Requirements

One provider will provide "soup to nuts" services:

- > Outreach
- > Assessment
- > Service Plan
- Transition
- Housing
- > Post-transition follow-up for 18 months

Transition Targets:

- Williams = 400 Class Members for FY22
- Colbert = 450 Class Members for FY22
