







Illinois Care Connections

The Illinois Department on Aging (IDoA), in partnership with the Illinois Assistive Technology Program (IATP), provides support aimed at enabling social connectedness; maintaining health, safety, and well-being; and promoting independence and community living.

Who is Eligible?

Individuals over 60 connected to, or receiving services from, an Area Agency on Aging (AAA), AAA-funded entity, Community Care Program Care Coordination Unit (CCP-CCU), Adult Day Service (ADS), Adult Protective Services agency (APS), or Home Care Ombudsman (HCO) are eligible for the Illinois Care Connections (ICC) program.













What Devices are Available?

- Technology tablet and needed accessories
- Durable Medical Equipment (DME) walkers, shower chairs, toilet risers, and other DME
- Activities of Daily Living (ADL) Devices to aid in bathing, grooming, cooking, and other daily living tasks
- Smart Home Devices smart doorbells, lightbulbs, door locks, and other smart devices

How Do I Sign Up?

Referrals must be submitted through one of the following IDoA funded providers:

- Community Care Program Care Coordination Unit (CCU);
- Adult Day Service provider (ADS);
- 3. Area Agency on Aging (AAA);
- 4. AAA-funded provider;
- Adult Protective Services agency (APS); or
- **6.** Home Care Ombudsman (HCO).

If you believe ICC could assist you, please contact one of these entities in your area to request that they submit a referral on your behalf.
