



How to access Adult Protective Services (APS) Registry information

The Adult Protective Services Act, 320 ILCS 20/, requires Adult Protective Services to keep confidential the information on the Adult Protective Services Registry.

While you won't have direct access to the information on the Adult Protective Services (APS) Registry due to laws regulating confidentiality, you can check the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) Healthcare Worker Registry to see if an employee has become ineligible to work in the health care field. There won't be a reason as to why that person has become ineligible, but the eligibility status of employees can be verified. Being on the APS Registry is only one of the reasons why someone would become ineligible to work in the health care field in Illinois.

Provider agencies are required to check eligibility status of workers upon hire and annually.
